Frank Kandel for the Outreach Commission

At our Tuesday evening Outreach Commission meeting of March 1, I shared an idea, where I was encouraged to share it with the congregation and invite a volunteer.

It has been over three years now since Shalom Mennonite Church started a relationship with Eastern Star Church, and by extension, with Arlington Woods Neighborhood Association.

From time to time, our congregation has been briefed on activities at the Neighborhood Association. For now, Shalom Mennonite Church's involvement in this organization is limited to my attending monthly Association meetings. However, the past couple of years, several Shalom members were involved in neighborhood cleanup days, which is very much appreciated by members of the Neighborhood Association.

Our involvement as a church is a positive one, and has created energy and great appreciation by the Neighborhood Association about our partnership. We hope that Shalom congregation will be more actively involved in our neighborhood's affairs.

#### Here is the Invitation:

We agreed that to have one other person from Shalom attend the Arlington Woods Neighborhood Association meeting with Zenebe. This will strengthen our relationship more, and when Zenebe is unable to attend a meeting, there will always be someone at the table representing our congregation. Meetings are scheduled for Monday evenings once a month for about an hour, and start at 6:00 PM. The next meeting will be Monday, March 28. Among the concerns the Outreach Commission addresses are social justice issues. Sometimes this involves engaging with 'The Powers'—that is, the recognized governmental authorities at the national, state, or local level. This carries some risk, because our ultimate loyalty is to God, not to Earthly powers.

Last Wednesday I had an encounter with 'the powers' by spending nine hours at the Indiana Statehouse with the Indiana Senate Judiciary Committee (I had previously done the same for four hours with the House Public Policy Committee on January 5th). The focus was on House Bill 1077, which sought to end the licensing of handguns in Indiana. I testified against the bill on behalf of Hoosiers Concerned about Gun Violence, because we support the licensing of handguns. We think that it keeps guns from getting into the hands of people who would not use them safely. The meeting went 1:30-10:30PM. Many people testified, mostly opposing HB 1077. Many law enforcement organizations opposed the bill, including the Indiana State Police, the Indiana Chiefs of Police, and the Indiana Fraternal Order of Police. I testified at about 7:30PM. (See my attached testimony, if you're interested in the details.)

After all of the testimony was heard, the Committee considered about a dozen amendments to the bill. All were rejected except one, which proposed creating a provisional handgun license to speed up the process, until the State Police could complete background checks to be sure that a person would be eligible for a regular license. That amendment passed 6-5, and **we were very pleased**. Then the Committee voted 11-0 to send the bill on to the full Senate. Then **the bad news** started to unfold. The original author of HB 1077 was very unhappy with the amended bill. So he went to the Senate President Pro Tem, claiming that a rule had been

violated in passing the amendment (it hadn't), asking him to send the amended bill to the Senate Rules Committee, instead of the full Senate. This is where bills go to die, when their author wants them 'killed'. What the author may now do, is to 'graft' the language of his original bill into another bill, to get it passed. This isn't supposed to happen, but this is the unethical way 'the powers' sometimes work. Now we have to hope that that 'grafting' doesn't pass, or that Governor Holcomb will veto the bill.

All of this is to tell you that working for social justice is sometimes very messy and frustrating, even with a government that is officially democratic. We can invest a lot of time and energy, and have all of our efforts wiped out by one or two powerful people who block the will of the people on an issue (80% of Indiana supports handgun licensing, including a majority of gun owners). But we need to keep showing up, and doing the right thing.

On another social justice issue at the Federal level, the House of Representatives has passed the Reauthorization of the Violence Against Women Act. This provides protection and financial and emotional support to women who have been abused. This isn't a perfect bill because they removed a provision which would have taken guns away from a person who has abused a woman, but we encourage you to ask our US Senators Todd Young and Mike Braun to support S 3623 Reauthorization of the Violence against Women Act.
