Jason Harms Rosales' Drum corps, *The Battalion*, will be warming up in military park starting between 1-2pm until about 2:45 on **Thursday**, **Aug 7**. Warmups are free and open to the public. Their performance in Lucas Oil is at 3:13 pm.

STOP REDISTRICTING EFFORT IN INDIANA: Vice-President J.D. Vance is coming to Indianapolis tomorrow to meet with Governor Braun to try to convince him to call legislators in for a special session to gerrymander our Congressional districts. Partisan gerrymandering contradicts the core principle of a representative democracy--that voters should choose their elected officials, not the other way around. If you are concerned about this, it is essential to send a clear message to the governor: no special session for redistricting.

Please call the governor's office at **317-232-4567.** Tell him that Hoosiers do not want or need new Congressional districts. Remind him that Indiana just passed a state budget that cuts programs for seniors, Hoosiers with disabilities and our most vulnerable citizens. Ask him how we have money for new maps if we can't afford to fully fund services that help Hoosiers in need. Remind Governor Braun that he works for us, not the White House. (You can also email him at https://www.in.gov/gov/contact-mike/)

Tomorrow (Thursday 8/6) there will be two additional opportunities to take action:

- 1) **Stand Up/Sit-In for Hoosier Democracy**: join MADVoters (MAD stands for Mutually Assured Democracy: https://www.madvoters.org/), partner organizations, state representatives, and concerned Hoosiers to tell Governor Braun to resist calls from the Trump Administration for gerrymandering in our state. **Indiana Statehouse**, **200 W. Washington St.**, **Indianapolis**, **8:00 am 2:00 pm**
- 2) Protest at the Governor's Mansion, 4750 N. Meridian St., Indianapolis from 4:00-6:00 pm.

PERSON OF COLOR BIO AUGUST: NATIONAL BLACK BUSINESS MONTH

Historian John William Templeton and engineer Frederick E. Jordan Sr founded National Black Business Month in August 2004 to "drive the policy agenda affecting the 2.6 million African American businesses."

Black business owners account for about 10% of U.S. businesses and about 30% of all minority-owned businesses. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, that amounts to approximately two million companies owned by African Americans.

His Place Eatery started as a catering business with chef James "Mackie" Jones and his mother, Jackie. During that time, he also worked for an area broadcaster in corporate sales but felt a change in his career might be coming. Jones began attending Ivy Tech Community College and graduated with honors in 2009 with a Hospitality Administration degree. Nearly two decades since moonlighting as a caterer, chef Jones and his wife, Shawn, craft handmade dishes offering "the best quality chef-inspired soul food dishes with a unique twist."
